Overall Comments

- This is a strong little film. Lots of resonant feelings about memory or perhaps a contrast between past and present. The use of cine film dissolving in and out of the film's central reality is really good and provides another layer of narrative. You don't need to say a word, it's all visually communicated, which is wonderful.
- Some lovely ideas in here, like dissolve from the cine projector to the bottle of whisky! There is definitely the sense that this character is going through some kind of psychological torment. But it's all very visually expressed which is great.
- You've made an exceptional effort with noir lighting, which is impressive. Very effective use of shadows, glare and contrast. And also really good use of dramatic framing, like the shot of the projected 8mm square with you on the right edge of frame. Really nice shots.
- In fact, technically, this is proficiently assembled with no issues. You seem to have mastered the art of match-cutting, like with the box opening. Nothing is jarring, it all feels very smooth and well put together.
- I also like the use of sound in this movie like the way the cine projector whirring fades in and the dramatic cuts on the cine projector clicks.
- I like the way you add subtle camera movement in these shots from smooth pans like the under the bed pan (maybe done in the edit) to slightly wobbly hand-held shots.
- Quite a leap you've made from your first film.

Assignment 2 Assessment potential

Research

Good research for this kind of noir film, old and new psychological thrillers. And there is something of the projection room scene and the resonant Rosebud motif from Citizen Kane here. And the long dissolves remind me a bit of the opening scenes of Apocalypse Now.
